

Assiniboine Park Conservancy Celebrates Completion and Upcoming Opening of The Leaf

Winnipeg, Manitoba, November 19, 2022 — The Assiniboine Park Conservancy (APC) celebrated the completion and upcoming opening of The Leaf today at a memorable gathering of special guests most closely connected with the once in a lifetime project. Located in Winnipeg's historic Assiniboine Park and surrounded by approximately 30 acres of new gardens and greenspace, The Leaf is the most significant horticultural development undertaken in Canada within the past 25 years.

Designed to fulfill a modern purpose by exploring the universal human connection with plants and nature, The Leaf features state of the art engineering and stunning architecture designed to create a transcendent visitor experience and optimal growing conditions for thousands of trees, shrubs, flowers, and other plant life flourishing in four unique indoor biomes.

Guests in attendance at today's celebration included the APC board of directors and leadership group, representatives from the three levels of government and industry partners, members of the design and construction teams, APC staff, and others who have helped make the vision for The Leaf a reality.

The project has been made possible by investments of up to \$35M from the Government of Canada and up to \$15M from the Province of Manitoba through the New Building Canada Fund: Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component – National and Regional Projects (PTIC-NRP). The Province is also contributing an additional \$10M for a total provincial investment of up to \$25M. The City of Winnipeg has contributed \$13.3M in capital funding to the project.

After a formal program that included greetings from dignitaries, guests were invited to explore The Leaf's four expansive biomes and enjoy a dazzling variety of special performances and demonstrations.

An opening date for The Leaf will be announced soon.

About The Leaf – Canada's Diversity Gardens:

- The Leaf Canada's Diversity Gardens is the final major phase in the redevelopment of Assiniboine Park and Zoo that got underway in 2009.
- The project consists of approximately 30 acres of new public gardens and greenspace known as the Gardens at The Leaf, which opened in July 2022, and The Leaf, a magnificent new indoor horticultural attraction. An opening date for The Leaf will be announced soon.
- The Leaf houses four unique indoor plant biomes:
 - o Hartley and Heather Richardson Tropical Biome
 - o Mediterranean Biome
 - o Babs Asper Display House
 - o Shirley Richardson Butterfly Garden
- Visitor amenities include beautifully appointed event and banquet facilities, indoor and outdoor programming spaces, a gift shop, coffee bar, and exciting new destination restaurant called Gather Craft Kitchen & Bar.
- Through horticultural and interpretive displays, education programs, on-site engagement, and special events, The Leaf Canada's Diversity Gardens will explore the human connection with nature and the role plants play in shaping our communities and cultures.
